Election Integrity

“Election integrity is the lifeblood of America’s representative democracy and, thus, the revelation of the multitude of gross irregularities and potential criminal behavior in Maricopa County, Arizona during the 2020 election mandates that Pennsylvania performs a full forensic audit of what occurred statewide – from registration to tabulation,” said Kathy Barnette, candidate for the United States Senate. “What occurred in Maricopa County also occurred in Montgomery County,” said Barnette, recalling how she proved deceased and “ghosts” had voted in her Congressional race in 2020. “Arizona’s report is demonstrating that the 2020 election was not as pure as the driven snow,” said Barnette. “Such a detailed study will either find proof of substantial election fraud that will drive election security reform efforts, or will show a safe and secure election and give Pennsylvanians confidence in the Commonwealth’s ability to protect their votes. A detailed investigation is what the people demand, and elected officials need to hear and understand that demand. “As your Senator, I will do everything I can to honor the demand that elections be free and fair. Protecting the vote cast by a citizen necessitates discounting votes cast illegally,” Barnette added. “No one should be silenced by the Left simply for raising concerns and wanting us to improve our election system going forward. If people cannot trust the results, the future of our nation is at stake.”

Clarify the mandates of the Federal Reserve... The Federal Reserve plays a significant role in creating income inequalities for certain wage earners. They pump up asset values for those who have assets and then taper quantitative easing when the bottom 90%'s wages begin to grow. Today, the Federal Reserve's primary focus is on monitoring wage growth. When there's growth in the bottom 90%'s income, this oftentimes signals to the Feds that inflation is impending. The Fed then rushes in and raises rates to stymie that growth. As your Senator, I will work to clarify the Fed's mandates to focus on stabilizing the U.S. dollar instead of punishing income growth. Since the creation of the Federal Reserve, during times when the dollar was stable, real wage growth for the bottom 90% increased by more than 3.5%. Conversely, during those times when the dollar was volatile, real wage growth for the bottom 90%, decreased -0.07%.

[Barnette] made a little less than \$10,000 in 2020 giving speeches to conservative groups, like anti-abortion organization Heartbeat International. She brought in \$17,000 more in royalties from her 2020 book, Nothing to Lose, Everything to Gain: Being Black and Conservative in America.

She and her husband also have between \$100,000 and \$215,000 saved up in joint bank accounts, and her husband has modest investments in a few mutual funds. She and her spouse also have some joint credit card debt — somewhere between \$15,000 and \$50,000 — and they both have some student loan debt. Between them, it’s between \$25,000 and \$65,000.

Barnette ran in 2020 to represent Pennsylvania's 4th Congressional District, which includes parts of Berks and Montgomery counties, but she was edged out by Democrat incumbent Madeleine Dean. America's national treasure, Kathy Barnette is a politician, author, and black rights activist. She has been serving her country as a member of the Republican Conservative party. Although her net worth is reported to be in the millions from book sales and tenure as a professor in finance there is no documented articles about her stance on stock investments for politicians and no mention of campaign finance reform.

Barnette counted herself as a definite or likely “no” vote for returning U.S. Sen. Mitch McConnell, R-Kentucky, as the Senate Republican’s floor leader.

Bartos called his decision in part a technical one based on a close reading of the Electoral Count Act, which he said gives the Congress a pretty ministerial role in the process. But he also explained that, given his familiarity with the county officials across Pennsylvania after a full year of campaigning, he has faith that the counties, who truly administer the elections in Pennsylvania, by and large did their jobs accurately and fairly.

Bartos gave less direct responses to other issues voters asked about – such as the integrity of the 2020 election. Several people expressed concern about election security and questioned the state’s election procedures. Bartos did not share his views on the issue one way or the other. Instead, he repeated frustrations that Pennsylvanians – in some restaurants – must show their ID

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and proof of vaccination to dine in, even though voters are not asked to show their ID every time they go to the polls. “Only in the mind of a left-wing, deranged ideologue does it make sense that we have to show an ID to eat, but we don’t have to show an ID to vote,” he said. Any changes to Pennsylvania’s election laws would have to be done at the state level, which Bartos acknowledged.

Bartos, who is chiefly a real estate developer, is involved in a dozen different real estate and construction companies, mostly in the Philadelphia suburbs. Throughout 2020, and up until he filed his disclosures in August 2021, he made more than \$700,000 from six different companies for which he's listed as a partner or managing member. In the case of a seventh, FMG Operating Company LLC, with which his campaign says Bartos is no longer affiliated but for which his wife handles operations, he's listed as an employee. He's also affiliated with five other, similar companies from which he drew compensation primarily in the form of stock dividends. For one of those companies, JAB Energy Services LLC, he's listed as the president. Stock income is reported less precisely in Senate filings, but between those five companies, as well as six other companies he's affiliated with where he also owns stock, he made somewhere between \$205,000 and \$1.2 million. Bartos and his wife also own significant stock unrelated to Bartos's business relationships, both jointly and separately. Holdings include Boeing, Apple, health insurance provider Anthem, BP Pipelines, General Motors, and Pfizer. He appears to have begun dabbling in cryptocurrency, too — he owns Ethereum and Bitcoin, both of which could be valued at up to \$15,000 apiece. He reported no liabilities. “From shadow-banning conservatives, censoring content online, biased fact-checking, and now funneling millions of dollars into our elections it’s become clearer than ever: Big Tech must be reined in,” Bartos, a Republican candidate for U.S. Senate from Pennsylvania, wrote on Twitter on July 1. But even as the suburban Philadelphia businessman parroted a popular Republican talking point, he and his wife also were enjoying the financial benefits that come with investing in such big tech titans as Alphabet Inc., which owns Google, and Apple. Financial disclosure forms that Bartos filed with the U.S. Senate as a requirement for his bid for the GOP nomination in 2022, show that he and his wife jointly and individually hold hundreds of thousands of dollars in stock in the Silicon Valley giants. As they head into the thick of one of the most closely watched U.S. Senate contests in the country, the filings underline the tightrope that the hopefuls walk as they talk tough on the outsized influence of big tech, but also see their wealth enlarged by their sizable investments. “If anything, it proves I’m not afraid to state my convictions, even if it’s against my financial interests,” [Bartos] said. “I can advocate for policies that I think are right. As a shareholder, who owns stock, I believe that the company needs to change for the better.” He added that it’s the “responsibility,” and the “duty” of shareholders to lodge such criticisms. Bartos, who accused social media sites such as Twitter and Facebook of “behaving like Democratic super PACs” for what he believes are unreasonable restraints on speech by conservatives, says he’d support “looking at anti-trust action if these companies don’t take a hard look at what they’re doing and change” their policies. “Even though you own stock in Alphabet, you can still say Google should be reined in because it’s anti-competitive,” Republican consultant Christopher Nicholas said. “Or there’s Amazon, which is on both sides of the equation. [Political journalists] will notice, but Mr. and Mrs. Pennsylvania will not be overly concerned about it.” That appears to be what Bartos is banking on as he heads into a competitive campaign season. “The reality is that as [voters] parse through stuff, [they will] understand it through the lens of common sense,” he said.

Election Integrity

Bochetto said much of his professional practice has concerned election law. He said he has worked from “a conservative point of view” in that and other areas. He claimed President Trump was “stonewalled,” preventing presentation of possible evidence of election fraud. Evidence was not in place in time to affect certification of election results, Bochetto said. He criticized election procedures of states including Pennsylvania, claiming practices such as mail-in balloting are not in compliance with federal law.

Philadelphia attorney George Bochetto both said that he would have voted to certify Pennsylvania’s 2020 election results.

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Bochetto, who during this campaign has often touted the fact that his law firm was asked to help frame the free speech defense for former President Donald J. Trump when he was tried on articles of impeachment in February 2021, also adopted a pro-certification stance when asked for a clarification after the debate.

Bochetto made plain during Tuesday’s debate that he believed the election was run under a law that improperly permitted no-excuse, mail-in balloting in Pennsylvania, which he said he would try to end if elected to the Senate. But he clarified to PennLive that he would have had to have left the 2020 results stand because there wasn’t a demonstration of widespread fraud at that time. Bochetto also made clear Tuesday that he would seek to end no-excuse mail-in balloting in the future.

He also said he is in favor of supporting individual freedoms, particularly when it comes to the covid-19 pandemic. He said he would like to see the nation take an approach similar to that of Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis or South Dakota Gov. Kristi Noem. Both have generally opted to avoid widespread shutdowns and mandates in response to the virus. “We cannot control people’s lives and tell them what to do and what not to do on a daily basis,” he said. “We can’t tell them they have to wear masks. We can’t tell them they must get vaccinated. Most people will make sensible choices. But we are not a totalitarian society.”

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Question: The U.S. is experiencing a malaise reminiscent of the late 1970s in terms of inflation, energy problems, and perceived international weakness. What needs to happen to turn this around?

Immigration

McCormick vowed to “be a strong advocate for policies that secure the border.” The Pennsylvania Republican visited the U.S.-Mexico border in February and met with U.S. Border Patrol agents. There the Border Patrol union endorsed him in his Senate race, saying in its announcement that McCormick “embodies the kind of strength needed to uphold the rule of law.” McCormick told Breitbart News he wants to see the southern border wall finished and terminate the Biden administration’s catch and release practice. Campaign financing – their current campaign contributors and their past donations to political organizations or PACs

Several top Wall Street executives have given major sums of money to the Senate campaign of former Bridgewater Associates CEO David McCormick, who is seeking the Republican Party’s nomination in Pennsylvania.

McCormick worked at Bridgewater in various roles from 2009-2022, and his wife Dina Powell McCormick is currently an executive at Goldman Sachs. Both McCormicks served in the George W. Bush administration, and Dina Powell McCormick also served in the Trump administration. Former President Donald Trump has endorsed David McCormick’s chief rival, former reality show host and heart surgeon Dr. Mehmet Oz, citing Oz’s perceived electability. More than 60 Goldman Sachs employees have donated to McCormick’s Senate campaign, according to an analysis from CNBC, including CEO David Solomon, who hosted a fundraiser for McCormick in February. Solomon donated the federal maximum \$5,8000 to McCormick’s campaign. In addition, Goldman Sachs chief of staff and secretary to the Board of Directors John Rogers has given \$50,000 to the pro-McCormick Honor Pennsylvania Super PAC.

Citadel CEO Ken Griffin has given \$7.5 million to Honor Pennsylvania, in addition to giving the federal maximum to the McCormick campaign. Griffin, a top GOP donor, has given large amounts of money to Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis, and his hedge fund paid \$810,000 in speaking fees to Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen in 2019 and 2020.

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“When I heard David was considering running for the Senate, I urged him to do so as our nation will be in good hands if talented and committed individuals like him are elected to public office,” Griffin told CNBC of his support for McCormick.

Other top donors to Honor Pennsylvania include former Actua Corporation CEO Walter “Buck” Buckley, who has given \$1.25 million, and Elliott Management CEO Paul Singer, who has given \$1 million. Singer also donated the federal maximum to the McCormick campaign. Blackstone CEO Stephen Schwarzman chipped in \$500,000 to Honor Pennsylvania.

McCormick’s Wall Street donors believe that he will be a more predictable and supportive senator than Oz, according to Kirkland & Ellis partner Reginald Brown. Brown donated the federal maximum to McCormick’s campaign.

“There’s a strong sense that [McCormick] won’t be a loose cannon and is ready to be a statesman in a very challenging world,” he explained to CNBC.

Speaking at a candidate town hall in Hershey, Pennsylvania last week, Oz advocated for increasing production of natural gas to solve global supply chain issues and best serve the environment. “If we were to use our natural gas right here, from under our feet, and use it to replace dirty coal from overseas manufacturers, it would be the equivalent of electrifying every U.S. car, plus putting a solar panel on every roof, plus doubling wind energy production — all together,” he said during the forum. **The move represents an about-face from Oz, who has in the past authored a number of columns urging Americans to be wary of the health risks of fracking.**

“It’s a fact that hydraulic fracturing pumps a lot of toxic chemicals (we know of about 24 offhand) deep underground at high enough pressure to fracture shale and release trapped gas and oil,” Oz wrote in a column in the *Herald-Tribune* in 2014. “In Pennsylvania, there are multiple reports of air and water contamination, possibly from hydraulic fracturing sites, causing folks breathing problems, rashes, headaches, nosebleeds, numbness, nausea and vomiting.”

To date, a laundry list of peer-reviewed studies have affirmed links between living near oil drilling and increased rates of respiratory illness, skin conditions, stress, and low birth weight. However, a full scientific understanding of the apparent correlation remains hampered by trade secret laws that protect oil companies from disclosing exactly what goes into their drilling fluids, even to doctors.

McCormick pointed again to Oz’s columns that, in addition to advocating for more gun control, also warned about negative health effects of fracking, and, in particular, the potential hazard it could create for nearby water supplies. “I can tell you, having gone to the sites and looking at the testing, that’s not a problem. There’s no evidence that’s a problem,” McCormick said.

McCormick added, “And so while Mehmet is now saying he’s a big proponent of fracking, he hasn’t been in the past, and I think that would be very dangerous for Pennsylvania given the importance of fracking to have somebody who is squishy on our energy capabilities.”

Oz, a Republican running for an open U.S. Senate seat in Pennsylvania, now promises to be a pro-life champion who will “always defend the sanctity of life.” His campaign says he has always been pro-life, but a newly uncovered interview casts doubt on this claim, according to a new Daily Wire report.

The Daily Wire pointed to a 2008 interview with Oz at the National Review of Medicine. Oz told the Canadian medical newspaper that he was not “socially conservative” and did not believe the government should create “obstacles” to abortion. “I have a very firm belief in individual rights. I don’t like the government telling me what to do and I believe that people should have free will to pursue their dreams,” Oz said at the time. “I don’t believe that we should be intruding into the private lives of homosexuals, and we should not be creating obstacles during the difficult time that women have when trying to terminate a pregnancy,” he continued. Here’s more from the report: He explained that while pregnancy and childbirth should be made easier for women, he also did not want to impede a woman’s ability to get an abortion. Oz continued that he believes “we should make it as easy as possible for women to carry a child to term and give it up for adoption,” but noted that “today’s climate makes it

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difficult for women to do what’s best for them and their fetus.” Responding to the 2008 interview, Oz communications director Brittany Yanick told the Daily Wire that the Republican candidate is pro-life and has been “vocal” about his position for “many years.” “Dr. Oz is strongly pro-life and adamantly opposed to abortion,” she said. “He spent his entire career saving lives.” People’s minds do change about abortion. Oz is running for the seat of retiring U.S. Sen. Pat Toomey, a pro-life Republican who also once supported legalized abortion. In March, Oz wrote an op-ed promising to be a “bold voice” for life in Washington, D.C. “I will be a bold voice in the Senate and a proud champion for the pro-life movement,” Oz wrote. “I won’t ever shy away from sharing my pro-life beliefs, even as pro-abortion advocates in medicine, the media, and Big Tech try to silence me. ... I will always defend the sanctity of life.” However, Oz’s struggle to define when life begins, despite being a medical doctor, in a December interview with Fox News also raised concerns for pro-life advocates. “As a doctor, I appreciate the sanctity of life. And for that reason I’m strongly pro-life, with the three exceptions ...” Oz said, listing rape, incest and the health of the mother, a broad exception that has historically gutted pro-life laws. “That’s how I would vote.” When asked when life begins, Oz said: “You know, I get it. If I’m pro-life, it’s a decision that comes back to the sanctity of when you think life does begin. And I believe it begins when you’re in the mother’s womb.” Pressed to clarify, Oz added, “... life’s already started when you’re in your mother’s womb. But it’s a rat hole to get trapped in the different ways to talking about it. We need, as a nation, to make sure the Constitution is appropriately followed, and people like me and you may be in the same camp, who are pro-life, have our feelings respected. And this is something that should not be taken away from us by a judiciary legislating from the bench.”

Who is funding the likely-to-fail campaign of Mehmet Oz, the celebrity known as Dr. Oz, who promoted unproven medical claims during the pandemic and is now trying to become a U.S. senator from Pennsylvania? It turns out, some of the richest people in the country. For starters, there’s the [Asplundh family](#), heirs to a tree-trimming fortune based in the Keystone State. Oz married into one branch of the family, which *Forbes* estimated was worth \$2.6 billion in 2015. Four people with the last name Asplundh donated \$15,000 to his campaign in December. [Oz himself](#) loaned his campaign \$5.2 million – the sort of money that most celebrities wouldn’t consider throwing away unless they knew they had an especially large stash as backup. Then there’s the Republican bigwigs. Former RNC finance chair [Steve Wynn](#), who stepped down in 2018 amid sexual misconduct allegations, gave \$11,600 with his wife Andrea. Donors cannot give more than \$5,800 directly to campaigns this year. Oz also received \$10,000 from activist investor [Nelson Peltz](#) and his wife Claudia, plus \$5,600 from [John Catsimatidis](#) and his daughter Andrea Catsimatidis.

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Former Trump commerce secretary, Wilbur Ross, who is not a billionaire despite claiming for years that he was one, donated \$11,600 with his wife Hilary Geary Ross. Wynn and Ross were part of a larger group of donors who reportedly hosted a fundraiser for Oz in Palm Beach, Florida last month.

One donor who has given to both Democrats and Republicans in recent years chipped into the pot. Pennsylvania billionaire Michael Rubin, who is the owner of sports retailer Fanatics, donated \$11,600 along with his girlfriend Camille Fishel. Rubin donated \$50,000 to Joe Biden's committees during the 2020 presidential election.

Other than that, Oz raised just \$670,000 from other donors in December. Roughly \$100,000 came from donors who self-reported a Pennsylvania residence, and about \$75,000 came from people who said they lived in Palm Beach, Florida.

Dr. Mehmet Oz, who is [running for the U.S. Senate](#) in Pennsylvania, has a considerable financial stake in major pharmaceutical firms and Silicon Valley giants, newly released records show -- despite railing against "Big Pharma" and "Big Tech" on the campaign trail.

The disclosures, released late Wednesday, indicate that the GOP candidate and celebrity television doctor has poured millions of dollars into companies like Amazon and CVS -- a revelation seemingly at odds with a central tenet of his message to voters.

"I've taken on Big Pharma, I've gone to battle with Big Tech," Oz said on Fox News in December. "I cannot be bought."

A political newcomer, Oz is facing off against David McCormick, a longtime hedge fund executive, in a competitive Republican primary. Both men have immense wealth, and some observers say Oz's investments could complicate his bid to connect with the Keystone State's blue-collar voting base.

According to the disclosure report, Oz, together with his wife, owns between \$6 million and \$27 million in Amazon stocks, between \$1.7 million and \$6.6 million in Microsoft, and between \$1.3 million and \$5.7 million each in Apple and Google's parent company, Alphabet Inc.

Oz and his wife also have between \$615,000 and \$1.3 million in shares of Thermo Fisher Scientific, between \$15,001 and \$50,000 in Johnson & Johnson, and between \$50,001 and \$100,000 each in CVS and the pharmaceutical company AbbVie.

Notably, one of Oz's campaign ads denouncing Big Tech includes Oz saying that he took on Facebook -- and indeed his disclosures do not show him owning any stock in the popular social media company.

In all, Oz's disclosure shows that he and his spouse together own between \$104 and \$422 million in various assets and holdings.

Among his other investments, Oz and his wife together own between \$11 million and \$51 million in shares of Asplundh Tree Trimming, a company co-founded by Oz's wife's family.

Other assets include between \$6 million and \$30 million in shares of the convenient store company Wawa, as well as between \$5 million and \$25 million in shares of the online health engagement platform Sharecare, where Oz sat on the board of directors until last year.

Oz and his spouse also own between \$1.5 million and \$6 million shares in the fertility clinic network Prelude Fertility, and between \$500,000 and \$1 million in shares of Pantheryx, a biotechnology company that specializes in bovine colostrum products. Oz has served as a director of both companies, the disclosure report shows.

According to the report, Oz and his spouse also own between \$11 million and \$47 million in commercial and residential real estate properties.

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Over the past year and a half, Oz reported earning between \$20 million and \$50 million, including more than \$2 million in salary as the host of "The Dr. Oz Show," more than \$7 million in profit from his company Oz Media, LLC, and millions of dollars in capital gains, dividends and interest from his various financial investments.

Oz's financial disclosures show he raked in between \$1 million and \$5 million on various made-in-China sleep products through a partnership with a Utah-based company. Oz has also come under fire for a partnership with Usana Health Sciences, a company that profits enormously from its business in China. McCormick charged that Oz's "huge economic ties" to China demonstrate that "once again, he's very conflicted on these issues."

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spokesperson however would not refer to what happened to the Armenians in World War I as “genocide.” “I think that’s indicative of a broader thing,” McCormick said, citing his own background of serving in the U.S. military in the 82nd Airborne Division in Iraq during the Gulf War. Oz also has a military background, having served in the Turkish military as a medical aide. McCormick said Oz “was wearing a Turkish uniform and serving in the Turkish military ... is a dual Turkish citizen, has deep business ties as we see on his financial disclosure, has deep connections to the senior-most people in Turkey, and the reason that’s such a problem is Turkey is an adversary. ... Our interests with Turkey diverge pretty dramatically in many ways. Turkey is pro-Iran, it’s pro-Syria, it’s anti-Israel. And the reason I call this out is, you know, Mehmet Oz couldn’t get a security clearance today, and it’s very hard for him to be an effective U.S. senator with those sorts of conflicts.”

Let’s face reality: The one size fits all model has failed our students. Pennsylvania spends more than the national average per student, yet our schools are ranked 37th in the nation. As a commonwealth, we’ve continued to throw money at a failing system and hope for change. Sensible people know, when you spend more money than the average, you expect better than average results. Sadly, that’s not what we see here. Instead of repeating the cycle, what if we broke the mold and became an innovator in education?

As Americans, we know better than others that competition drives innovation. It’s the cornerstone of our economy that has built us into one of the greatest systems. For too long, our school system has operated in a manner that placates unions and is specifically inhibitive of competition. Introducing a competitive factor to how we fund education has the potential to be a major catalyst for change. As your senator, it’s my hope to work toward that change.

Last year, Sens. Tim Scott (R-SC) and Lamar Alexander (R-TN) introduced the School Choice Now Act. The legislation, if passed, among other things would:

- Allow parents to choose the academic instruction that works best for their child.
- Provide funding for scholarship-granting organizations throughout the state.
- Prohibit federal control of education to ensure that all education providers may be able to participate without fear of federal control.
- Allow states to create their own tax credit scholarship program that works for the unique needs of students in their state.

This act reimagines the education sector as a competitive place where schools are driven to perform at a higher level and compete for tax dollar funding, as opposed to being guaranteed a certain amount based on the overall enrollment. Private schools that often do better at a lower

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overhead cost would have the ability to expand and present every student with an opportunity for a better education that is not limited in scope or quality by their zip code.

Opponents to educational opportunity initiatives often parrot the argument that it is a net negative for inner-city and disadvantaged students. Their argument isn't based in any sphere of reality, especially in Pennsylvania. Recent polling of inner-city parents showed that if finance wasn't a limiting factor, 39.6 percent of parents would choose to send their children to private school, another 30.69 percent would send their children to a charter school, and 17.82 percent would choose to homeschool. Only 11.88 percent of parents polled in Philadelphia would send their children to their zoned school.

Parents and students alike are frustrated with our school system as it is. Unclear guidance during a challenging time, standards that don't always challenge students at their level, and lesson plans designed to drive political agendas in the classroom have shaken confidence in our public schools. It's time we take a step back, revisit the drawing board, and create a system that works for our students—not for unions and politicians. We can give each child in Pennsylvania an education that works for them; an education without indoctrination or political bias. An education that will put Pennsylvania back on track to bring businesses and opportunity to our commonwealth. Isn't that what we'd all like?

The pledge reads as follows: “I pledge that as a member of Congress I will cosponsor and vote for the U.S. Term Limits Amendment of three (3) House terms and two (2) Senate terms and no longer limit.”
